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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK:

Dear Parents and Friends of Cawdor PS

It was lovely to see so many parents and carers at our Sports Fun Day last Friday. Once again it was a wonderful day and credit goes to the three captains, Alex Sitkowski, Sean Halfpenny and Jonty Galloway, for leading their houses with excellent sportsmanship. Congratulations to the winning house on the day, the Rosellas.

The staff had their first school planning workshop on the Monday evening of Week 2 and will be working together again tonight to formulate strategic directions and begin planning for 2015—2017. Thank you to the parents who have returned their surveys. If you haven't yet done so, please try to return your survey by the end of this week so that your ideas can be considered for our plan. The students have also been surveyed in their classes and have made some excellent suggestions for our school.

With the start of the warmer weather we have had a snake sighting in the school's vegetable garden so we have put into place strategies for snake risk management. Snakes are animals that naturally inhabit the school's environment so all the students have been made aware of ways to keep safe in the playground and have been reminded of "no go" zones. During the summer months students will not be allowed to visit the vegetable gardens unless accompanied by a staff member in a small group. The teachers have also discussed actions to be taken if anyone sees a snake.

Next weekend the roof on the Possums' classroom will be replaced and the end wall nearest the canteen will be waterproofed. We have had ongoing issues with rain coming into the classroom and wetting the carpet so I have been successful in negotiating with DEC Asset Management Unit to have the roof replaced at no cost to the school. After the roof replacement, the carpet will also be replaced, again at no cost to the school, and the Possums should have a healthier classroom environment.

Next week we will be welcoming our new Kindergarten children who will be starting in 2015, as they begin their Countdown to Cawdor program with the Orientation Day on Thursday.

Fun Sports day


