Snippets of Cawdor's History

St Jerome's Anglican Church which is used as a hall by the school, was opened on 19th July 1905. The record of service for that day states that 200 people were in the church with 100 outside in the grounds.

A highlight of 1955 was the making of the movie "Smiley". All of the children of the school were involved in some way as well as many local horse riders. St Jerome's church hall was a feature, complete with a makeshift cemetery.

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
